The first seminar in the SGS series from October 2022 through June 2023, a seminar co-facilitated with Dr. Gabriela Spears-Rico, discussing Indigeneity across Central and North America, situating Indigeneity through the real, the imagined and the symbolic.

Indigenous Cosmology and Storytelling: Methods and Praxis for Thinking, Data & Society, February 2023. The second seminar in the SGS series from October 2022 through June 2023, was co-facilitated with Alex Jacobs-Blum and Yuma Dean Hester, discussing different forms of Indigenous methodologies through means of storytelling, film and collaboration. In English and Spanish.

Decolonization is not possible & the Decolonial Gesture, Data & Society, April 2023. The third seminar in the SGS series from October 2022 through June 2023, was co-facilitated with Emmanuel Rozenhal and Vilma Alexandra, challenging mainstream conversations around decolonization, power, territory and language. In English and Spanish.

Sacredity as a path towards trust / Lo Sagrado como camino hacia la confianza, Data & Society, June 2023. The final seminar in the SGS series from October 2022 through June 2023, was co-facilitated with the Indigenous Council of Cauca, Colombia (CRIC), we encountered questions of permission, consent, the sacred and kinship with AI. How do we protect Indigenous communities in parallel to AI expansion, Can an AI be taught Indigenous cosmologies and stories, what does it mean for an AI to ask an elder or community member for permission? In English and Spanish.

Revi(suali)sing Intersectionality, Pt IV, intimacy, DeZIM Institut, Berlin, DE, December 2019. The fourth conversation out of the series included talks and performances by Shaka McGlotten, James Batchelor and Zander Porter. We considered digital technology's promotion of hypervisuality regarding our bodies which shape our relations, our intimacies. Here, we mutually recognized a shared togetherness within the digital sphere and discovered a feeling of alienation, or even seduction.

Revi(suali)sing Intersectionality, Pt III, perception, DeZIM Institut, Berlin, DE, November 2019. The third conversation included an experiential talk from Ashkan Sepahvand and live drawing by Nine Yamamoto-Masson. Ashkan's experiential talk highlighted that perception is a relation, where agency corroborates beyond the visual. Nine Yamamoto-Masson produced live illustrations throughout the conversation.

Revi(suali)sing Intersectionality, Pt II, sameness, DeZIM Institut, Berlin, DE, October 2019. The second conversation hosted a screening of Stephanie Comilang's "Come to Paradise." We investigated how sameness attempts to disentangle the narrative of difference.
